KITCHEN FIRE SAFETY



Each October, the City of Tallahassee Fire Department and National Fire Prevention Association promote Fire Prevention Week to enhance public safety through education and awareness. Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. Implement these steps to reduce your risk and prevent cooking fires.

- Never leave cooking unattended.
- Move flammable items, like paper towels and potholders, away from the stove.
- Make sure children and pets stay at least three feet away from a hot stove, grill or fryer.
- Turn handles of pots or pans toward the back of the stove so no one can bump them or pull them over.

If an accident happens, it's important to know how to respond.

- Keep a lid nearby to smother small grease fires. Smother the fire by sliding the lid over the pan and turn off the stovetop. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

When in doubt, get out! Fires can spread quickly. To help you get the early warning necessary to escape a deadly fire, ensure your home's smoke alarms are properly placed and maintained. For more fire safety information, visit **Talgov.com/Fire.**
